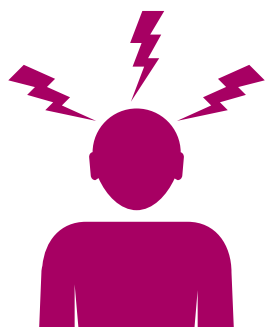


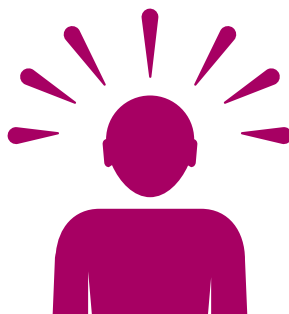

Top unsafe behaviours by younger drivers:
